Marcello Clarich has been full professor of administrative law at the Sapienza University of Rome since 2018. Since 1999 he has held the same teaching position at the Luiss Guido Carli University in Rome and since 1988 at the University of Siena. He was a Visiting Scholar at the University of Frankfurt and holds a master's degree (LL.M.) from Harvard Law School.

He has been part of study commissions for the drafting of regulatory texts (in 2022 the Code of public contracts and the reform of local public services).

He is the author of numerous publications on antitrust, privatisation, credit law, procedure and administrative process. He has published a manual of administrative law (V ed., Il Mulino, 2022) and a manual of administrative justice (I ed. Il Mulino, 2021).

He has been a cassation lawyer since 1992 with offices in Rome. From 2003 to 2012 he was a partner in the law firm Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer. He carries out consultancy and advocacy activities, above all before the Council of State and the Tar.
