Daniela Di Cagno is a microeconomist whose research devotes particular attention to the individual decision mechanisms with respect to which it is proposed to study, mainly through the use of experimental techniques, the violations of the predictions of the more traditional theory in light of the contributions of the behavioral and of the knowledge economy. She is Director of the Luiss Centro di Economia Experimentale whose CESARE laboratory is active both for face-to-face experiments and online Lab techniques. The results of her research, which mainly concern the issues of choices in conditions of risk and uncertainty and division problems and game theory, are published in sector journals such as Experimental Economics, Applied Economics, Journal of Economic Psychology, Journal of Behavioral Decision Making, and Journal of Economic Behavior and Organization.
