Vieri Ceriani, special adviser to Commissioner Paolo Gentiloni, was born in Rome on March 6, 1950. He graduated in 1974 in Economics from the "La Sapienza" University of Rome (supervisor Prof. Federico Caffè). Winner of the Bonaldo Stringher scholarship, in 1976 he joined the Bank of Italy's Research Department, where he dealt with public finance. Between 1993 and 2001 he was Economic Advisor to various Finance Ministers. From 2004 to 2011 he was the Bank of Italy's Head of the Tax Relations Service. From November 2011 to May 2013 he was Undersecretary of State at the Ministry of Economy and Finance (Monti government). He was then advisor for fiscal policies to ministers Saccomanni and Padoan. Until December 2018 he was CEO of SOSE. He has participated in numerous committees, working groups, commissions at the OECD, the European Commission, the European Council, the ECB, national and international public and private institutions. He is the author of publications on public finance issues, in particular on tax policy, fiscal federalism and budget policy.
