

Dimitri Zurstrassen

Dimitri Zurstrassen is currently a researcher in history of European integration at Sorbonne University (France) and UCLouvain (Belgium) where he is finishing his PhD thesis on the evolution of EU industrial policy from 1974 to 2002. This multidisciplinary study, based on the analysis of various institutional and private archives, as well as several interviews with the actors involved, studies in particular the transition from an interventionist Community industrial policy to a mainly horizontal industrial policy, using the interventions of the European Commission in the steel industry as a case study. In recent years, he has taken part in several research projects on the history of European integration, such as the oral history project of the European Commission (1986-2000) coordinated by UCLouvain, and the oral history of the Court of Justice of the European Union, a research project coordinated by the Max Planck Institute for the History and Theory of Law based in Frankfurt am Main (Germany). He is also the author of several publications on the EU industrial policy and national industrial policies. He co-edited the book "EU Industrial Policy in the Multipolar Economy" published in October 2022 and has published various book chapters on the history of EU and national industrial policies. As an academic expert, he is currently a member of the scientific committee of the Eurosteelmater (European Advanced Course Training Course for the Worldwide Steel Sector), organized by RINA with the support, among others, of Eurofer, the European Commission and IndustriAll.
