# Subject: Call for application to the grant of n. 1 "Jo Cox" fellowship in the framework of the EU funded project EU-IOSAC (EACEA) - Project: 101127624 - EACEA (EC)

The Luiss Institute for European Analysis and Policy (LEAP), hosting the Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence named **EU-Inclusive Open Strategic Autonomy Centre** (EU-IOSAC)<sup>1</sup>, co-funded by the European Commission within the framework of the Erasmus+ program, is opening a call for applications for the following opportunity:

**n. 1 "Jo Cox" fellowship**: the "Jo Cox" fellowship aims to support researchers by providing a two-month visit to Luiss Guido Carli University (Luiss) to conduct research alongside colleagues at LEAP and within the broader Luiss community. The recipient of the fellowship will be expected to deliver a seminar in the framework of the Jean Monnet seminar series and publish a working paper within the EU-IOSAC Working Paper series "Europe in the global world: economic and geo-political challenges". The financial support for the fellowship is maximum  $\in$  4.000,00 gross (according to Italian applicable fiscal law). The fellowship will cover a specific research contract and travel costs for coming to LEAP in Rome (no lump-sum contribution will be granted).

## **Eligibility Criteria**

Applications are open to researchers with a demonstrated interest in European analysis and policy.

#### **Application Requirements and Procedures**

The applicant should submit:

- A detailed academic and professional curriculum vitae (CV);
- A research proposal (two pages maximum) outlining the intended focus and objectives during the fellowship;
- A copy of a valid Identity Document.

#### **Selection procedures**

Applications will be assessed on the basis of the candidate's professional curriculum vitae (CV) as well as their academic publication and research proposal. The Evaluation Committee shall be composed of:

- the Scientific Coordinator of the project;
- a project team component;
- an internal member.

The Evaluation Committee will check eligibility of the applications and communicate the final outcome of the selection procedure on the website: <u>https://leap.luiss.it/</u> by the end of June 2024. The awarded candidate will be informed using the e-mail contact indicated in the application. A reserve list of candidates will be considered. The successful candidate must confirm his/her formal acceptance and other requested documents within 5 working days from the date of the received communication. Failing to do so, the Evaluation Committee will move to the first candidate of the reserve list.
