- 8. Security and diplomatic challenges in a globalized world.

Young scholars are especially encouraged to submit their academic work, as each year the best Working Paper/Policy Brief will be awarded a prize of \in 2.500,00 (to be paid according to applicable Italian tax law).

Submission Guidelines

Both Working Papers and Policy Briefs should be original works that contribute substantively to the discussion of Europe's position in the global landscape. Manuscripts should be:

between 20 and 30 pages for Working Papers and between 5 and 10 pages for Policy Briefs.

Please include an abstract of no more than 1 page summarizing the paper's key arguments and findings and five bullet points highlighting the submission's key take-aways.

Publication and Review Process

All submitted papers will undergo a peer-review process providing constructive feedback to the authors. Accepted papers will be published in the EU-IOSAC working paper series with associated ISSN number and disseminated through LEAP's social media and newsletters and the Luiss Guido Carli's official communication network.

Selection procedures for the best Working Paper/Policy Brief

Final selection of the best Working Paper/Policy Brief will be formulated by assessing all submitted papers received on the basis of the following evaluation criteria:

- Originality: the level at which the product introduces a new way of thinking about and/or
 interpreting the scientific object of the research and stands out and innovates compared to
 previous approaches;
- Methodological rigour: the level at which the product clearly presents the objectives of the
 research and the state of the art in the literature, adopts an appropriate methodology and
 eventually demonstrates that the objectives have been achieved;
- Impact: the degree to which the product influences the national/international scientific community.

The author may enter only one paper in the competition.

The Evaluation Committee will verify the formal regularity of the documents and will communicate the grantee of the prize. The Evaluation Committee bears full responsibility for the selection procedure and its result. The selected grantee will be informed using the e-mail contact indicated in the application. A reserve list of candidates will also be prepared.
