Dimitri Zurstrassen is currently a policy analyst and researcher on EU industrial policy at the Luiss Hub for New Industrial Policy and Economic Governance (LUHNIP). He is also a research associate at the Mondes Modernes et Contemporains research centre (Free University of Brussels). He holds a PhD in Contemporary History from Sorbonne University (France) and UCLouvain (Belgium). In recent years, he has taken part in several research projects on the history of European integration, such as the oral history project of the European Commission (1986-2000) coordinated by UCLouvain, and the oral history of the Court of Justice of the European Union, a research project coordinated by the Max Planck Institute for the History and Theory of Law based in Frankfurt am Main (Germany). He is also the author of several publications on the EU industrial policy, national industrial policies and EU competition policy. He co-edited the book "EU Industrial Policy in the Multipolar Economy" published in October 2022 and has published various book chapters and working papers on EU and national industrial policies and EU State aid policy.
